Dear Friends,

We are continuing our journey through testimonies in the Bible and we will be concluding this week with the disciples who were travelling to Emmaus. Our first testimony was by Paul, a prominent and well-educated Jewish convert who had heard and seen Jesus but never accepted Him during His time on earth. Last week the testimony was by a socially outcast Samaritan who had never heard or seen Jesus but accepted Him at the first opportunity. The Emmaus disciples had heard, seen, and accepted Jesus during His ministry but were still left hopeless after the Crucifixion.

I believe the Holy Spirit led me to change things up this week and prepare a message about the Emmaus disciples because I wonder sometimes if we struggle with what they struggled with. They believed in what Jesus taught them with their whole beings; they obviously did not understand everything He tried to teach them about Himself, but the point is they were dedicated, committed followers of His. They were willing to share their testimonies with someone they thought was a random stranger about who they believed Jesus was, but it was inadequate because they couldn't share in the belief of the Resurrection.

Contrast this to their testimonies after Jesus revealed Himself to them. They headed back to Jerusalem that very evening to testify to the other disciples that Jesus was truly resurrected from the dead. Their testimonies had no power until they included the resurrection. Their lives had no power until they experienced the resurrected Jesus.

The question I want us to consider in preparation for Sunday is, "Does the Jesus I am testifying about have the power of the Resurrection in Him?" Are we simply reciting back what the Scriptures tell us about His resurrection or is our very nature changed by His resurrection? This experience with the resurrected Lord changed them from hopelessly defeated men to men who ran 7 miles in the dark to get back and tell their friends about what happened to them. I look forward to unpacking their excitement with you on Sunday (running shoes are optional). Blessings!
